TYPES OF GASTRECTOMY: BASED ON AMOUNT OF STOMACH REMOVED

Total Gastrectomy:

- Entire stomach removal.
- Indicated for extensive gastric cancer.
- · Reconstruction with esophagojejunostomy.

Near Total Gastrectomy:

- Residual upper stomach.
- Considered in select cases.

Subtotal Gastrectomy:

- · Part of stomach removed.
- Used for localized tumors.

Partial Gastrectomy:


- Specific section removal.
- Distal, proximal, or wedge resections.


Hemi Gastrectomy:

- Half of stomach removed.
- Part of complex surgeries.

Antrectomy:

- Antrum removal.
- Common in peptic ulcer cases.
- Reconstruction links stomach to jejunum.
