

STRAWBERRY GALLBLADDER

Strawberry gallbladder, also known as cholesterolosis, is a condition where the gallbladder mucosa becomes dotted with yellow cholesterol deposits, resembling a strawberry-like appearance.

STRAWBERRY GALLBLADDER

Appearance:

• Yellow cholesterol deposits on the gallbladder mucosa give it a speckled appearance, resembling strawberries.

Incidence:

• Commonly associated with longstanding gallbladder inflammation or conditions like gallstones.

Symptoms:

• Typically asymptomatic, but in some cases, patients may experience mild abdominal discomfort.

Diagnosis:

• Often identified incidentally during imaging studies such as ultrasound or during surgery.

Management:

• Treatment may not be necessary unless symptoms are present. In severe cases, cholecystectomy (gallbladder removal) might be considered.
